Louis-Hercule Levasseur

Louis-Hercule's youth

Louis-Hercule was born on June 22, 1818 in Trois-Rivières. His parents were Paul Levasseur and Marie-Françoise Potiers or Pothier and married on February 20, 1816 in Trois-Rivières. He was their second child. His older brother, Paul-Prisque, died on February 15, 1819 in Trois-Rivières; he was less than 2 years old. Louis-Hercule became the eldest. Seven more children were born, but four of them died at a young age.

Four months after the birth of the youngest Adolphe, his father, Paul Levasseur, died on January 26, 1830 in Trois-Rivières at the age of 44. His passing was certainly a shock to the family. He left, in addition to his wife, four children, the oldest of whom was Louis-Hercule, who was only eleven years old.

The following year, his mother Marie-Françoise remarried with Jean-Baptiste Martineau dit Saintonge August 8, 1831 in Trois-Rivières, thus giving a father to his children. Two months later, the youngest, Adolphe, died at the age of two. Of Paul and Marie-Françoise's nine children, three boys reached adulthood.

Marriage of Louis Hercule and Josephte Longval

Louis-Hercule married Josephte Longval, known as Fafard, on October 7, 1844 at the Immaculée-Conception church in Trois-Rivières. Josephte's parents are Louis Longval dit Fafard and defunct Angélique Buisson. Louis-Hercule is 26 years old and Josephte is 34 years old. In the marriage certificate, Louis-Hercule Levasseur and Louis Longval are described as farmers; these, like Jean-Baptiste Saintonge, declared that they did not know how to sign.

One year after their marriage, a first daughter, **Marie, was born on October 17**, **1845 in Trois-Rivières**.

A first son, Louis, was born February 5, 1847. It was he who continued the genealogical line up to us. He is also the only boy of the couple who went to adulthood and got married.

Adèle was born around 1849. Éléonore was born on January 3, 1851.

Onésime-David, born May 3, 1852, was the last child of the couple Louis-Hercule and Josephte Longval. Their 5 children were born in Trois-Rivières.

In the 1851 census, Josephte's father, 81-year-old Louis Longval, lives with the family of Hercules on land in the suburbs of Trois-Rivières. Catherine Gouin and Modeste Poulin are identified as servants.

Onésime-David died on May 12, 1858 at the age of six.

Josephte Longval died on February 11, 1868 in Trois-Rivières, at the age of about 58 years. She left 4 children aged between 15 and 20 years old.

In the 1871 census, Hercules lived with his four children. His brother Narcisse, who was single, lived near Hercules in a house where lived 2 families of 2 children each.

1858 Started in 1854, the construction of the Cathedral The Assumption of the Virgin (362 Bonaventure Street) ended in 1858 and was consecrated shortly thereafter. The same year, the old stone church of 1710 ceases to serve as a parish church and is used as an auxiliary chapel. Thus, the cathedral becomes the place of worship of the parish of the Immaculate Conception. July 1, 1867 The Canadian Confederation was enacted to form the Dominion o f Canada, regrouping the provinces of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Quebec under a federation subject to the British

Crown.

The children

- On May 7, 1872, Marie married Édouard Milot in Trois-Rivières. She was 26 years old.
- On October 7, 1872, Louis married Léa Moreau in Trois-Rivières. Louis was 25 years old and Léa was 19 years old.
- On July 8, 1873, Éléonore married Hormidas Cloutier in Trois-Rivières. She was 22 years old.
- On January 26, 1875, Adèle married Hubert Rivard-Dufresne at the Immaculée-Conception Church in Trois-Rivières. She was 25 years old

According to the 1881 census, Hercules and his brother Narcisse lived with Louis, Léa and their 6 children. (Note 1)

Note 1: Since Hercule lives with his son, it is probable, that in return for giving his farm to his son Louis, he is obligated to lodge and feed his father, Hercule. It is further authenticated since Louis is his only living son. This detail should be verified in the official archives of the Land registry office.

Marie and her husband Édouard Milot had four children: Hormisdas, Henri, Rose-Anna and Arthur. Marie died on February 27, 1887 in Saint-Grégoire, Nicolet, at the age of 41 years. She left 4 children between 2 and 9 years old. Two of the children, Hormisdas and Rose-Anna, were adopted by Marie's sister, Éléonore, married to Hormisdas Cloutier who have no children. As for Édouard Milot, he remarried with Marie Dallaire on September 16, 1887 in Trois-Rivières. This couple moved to Roberval with 2 other children Milot, Henri and Arthur.

Louis and his wife Lea Moreau had 17 children, all born in the suburbs of Trois-Rivières and baptized at the Cathedral L'Assomption which is the church of the parish Immaculate Conception in Trois-Rivières. Louis and Lea sheltered Louis-Hercule, father of Louis, and Narcisse, the brother of Louis-Hercule. Louis-Hercule died on March 22, 1889. Léa Moreau, wife of Louis, died July 29, 1894 at the age of 41, 10 days after the birth of their 18th child, Philomène who survived. Twelve of the children are alive. Narcisse, brother of Hercules, died on September 25, 1906 at the age of 86 years.

Adèle and her husband Hubert Rivard-Dufresne had 7 children (at least they were alive at the 1891 census). Two of their children, Edmond and Henri, left a trace and were married to St. Gregoire of Nicolet. Adèle passed away on June 8, 1893 in Saint-Grégoire, Nicolet. She left 7 children (at least they were alive at the 1891 census). Her husband Hubert Rivard-Dufresne remarried Eugénie Duguay on January 8, 1896 at St-Jean-Baptiste Church in Nicolet.

Éléonore and Hormisdas Cloutier did not have children. According to the 1881 census, Eleonore and Hormisdas kept Joséphine Lemerise, 9 years old. This is the daughter of Arthur Lemerise and Amaryllis Levasseur. The link is the following: Amaryllis is the daughter of Olivier, who is the son of Francis, who is the son of Ignatius 4th generation. In the 1891 and 1901 censuses, Éléonore and Hormisdas kept their nephews Hormisdas and Anna Milot since their mother, Marie Levasseur, died in 1887. In 1911, Anna was still living there. Éléonore died on March 20, 1921 in Trois-Rivières.




